By the time you leave at 16, you will have started to have an idea of what career you wish to pursue in the future. You will most certainly know what your next steps are after your GCSEs, as a result of careful exploration and consideration of your future options. From years 7 to 11, you will have had access to a range of experiences and guidance about the training and education available to you after GCSEs and beyond. You will have also learned how to research and plan for your future and even identify when you should adapt or even change your plans.

You will develop these skills through the Personal Development Curriculum. Equally, you will also receive delivery through your academic subjects, where it is important to understand the significance of what you learn there for your future lives.

The key people in helping you to plan for your future are:

- Your Form Tutor who delivers the Personal Development Curriculum and is also the person who knows you best.
- The Careers Adviser who gives individual careers advice and guidance to students in years 10 and 11.
- The Careers Lead who negotiates for your opportunities with outside agencies.
